Practice Profile

Jonathan returned to private practice in July 2013, following four valuable years serving as an Advocate Depute. His intensive trial experience included almost three years as a Senior Advocate Depute, and two years as dedicated Crown Counsel to the Health and Safety Division within Crown Office. While for much of this time Jonathan was conducting High Court trials, he also regularly appeared in the Appeal Court.

In 2011, Jonathan appeared on behalf of the Lord Advocate in the Supreme Court in *Jude v HMA* [2012] SC (UKSC) 222 (concerning the admissibility of admissions to police questioning and time-bar under the Scotland Act 1998). He was involved in drafting the Crown's written submissions in *Ambrose v Harris* [2012] SC (UKSC) 51 (also concerning the admissibility of admissions to police detention and interrogation). Jonathan drafted the Lord Advocate's Written Intervention in the media hyped *Assange v Sweden* [2012] 2 AC 471, [2012] UKSC 22 (concerning issues relating to enforcement of a European Arrest Warrant under the Extradition Act 2003).

Jonathan resumed a civil practice, his area of work as junior counsel. As a Standing Junior Counsel - first to the Secretary of State for Scotland and then to the Department of Work and Pensions - Jonathan undertook a variety of government work involving questions of public administrative law. Other principal areas of focus were in relation to personal injury, professional negligence (medical, solicitor and surveyor), NHS disciplinary tribunals, defence instruction in health and safety prosecutions, plus some planning work.
